To Whom It May Concern

Re: The Devotion to the Flame of Love

I am happy to be a Pastor of the two Parishes, three Churches, here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. I am surrounded by faithful people who are committed to Christ and His Church.

Several parishioners approached and asked my permission to begin a small prayer group, called a Cenacle, that finds its zeal and grounding in the devotion called The Flame of Love. In the early 1960's in communist Hungary, Jesus and Mary introduced this devotion to a widowed mother of six and Secular Carmelite named Elizabeth Kindelmann.

Even during her lifetime in Budapest, many priests accepted her revelations because they saw her goodness. In June 2009, after a few years of investigation, Cardinal Erdo, the Primate of Hungary, said that her writings were free from any error and gave his approval to the Flame of Love Movement. Many other diocesan bishops, including our own, have also given approval.

Knowing each of the parishioners well, their great love and devotion to the Church, I had no problem giving my blessing to the forming of a local Cenacle for our Partnering Parishes. I have joined in prayer with them on several occasions as they meet every Thursday evening in Church for about one hour of prayer and adoration.

His Eminence Cardinal Péter Erdö, Primate of Hungary, established The Flame of Love Movement as a Private Association of the Faithful with **Juridic Personality**. Please note that Private Associations are not necessarily approved but any Association with Juridic Personality **must** be approved by a competent ecclesiastical authority. So though the Movement was established in Budapest, the approval is for the Universal Church.


Fortunately, a Hungarian priest, Fr. Rona, S.J., was a missionary to Latin America and translated her Hungarian diary into Spanish. The Movement started early in Latin America and came to some areas in the United States from Mexico, and from a Canadian center. Now, the center for the Flame of Love Movement in the United States is here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, at

St. Mary Magdalen Parish, Media, Pennsylvania. Reverend Monsignor Ralph J. Chieffo is the National Spiritual Director for the Flame of Love of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Movement.

Please consider opening your heart to those who may approach you and ask your permission to start a Cenacle for your diocese and or parish. I believe God is calling men and women, to greater holiness as they join in adoring Our Lord's Eucharistic Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament, pray the holy rosary, make reparation for sins and sinners, further the Kingdom of God, and ignite within families the Flame of Love of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, so that more and more graces will flow to transform hearts, Church and world for the glory of God/
